## Rewards Update

### Progress Rewards Stickers

These will continue in their current format for Year 7 to Year 9 with stickers being awarded to students who demonstrate progress. The new designs, created as part of a Community competition last year, are now being used. Students have been getting weekly updates about form totals with rewards for the top tutor group in each year. A 'certificate' system is still being arranged for Year 10 and Year 11 students so that they receive a certificate with their progress sticker outlining what they have done. Prizes will also be awarded on a regular basis so the more stickers the students log, the more chance they have of being the recipient of the prize.

### Rewards Activities

Rewards activities will take place at the end of December and July. Those students with 95% or above attendance and no more than 2 pink referral forms will be given a letter inviting them to take part in an 'off-site' activity. This week students will be visiting Cinebowl in Uttoxeter and have had the choice of watching a film, ten pin bowling or ice skating. Other students have chosen to watch the Cinderella Pantomime at the Derby Arena.

### Rewards Trips

Attendance % for the summer term rewards starts on the first day of next term starting January 4<sup>th</sup> 2017. Students will be made aware of the cut-off point for attendance - the date when the lists of those to be invited will be printed. Referral forms - for the purpose of the trips, all students start on 0 on the first day of next half term.
