<p><b>HISTORY GCSE</b></p>  <p>Taught by : Miss Sargeant, Mr Whyman</p>	<p>Students will study four units that will be examined at the end of Year 11.</p> <p>The units are;</p> <p><b>Unit 1 - Crime and Punishment in Britain 1000-present day.</b></p> <p><b>Unit 2 - Early Elizabethan England 1558-88</b></p> <p><b>Unit 3 - The Cold War</b></p> <p><b>Unit 4 - Weimar and Nazi Germany, 1918-39</b></p> <p>Each unit is assessed by a written exam in Year 11.</p> <p>Paper 1-1 hour 15 mins 30% Paper 2 -1 hour 45 mins 40% Paper 3- 1 hour 20 mins 30%</p> <p>*Units two and three are examined together on one paper.</p>	<p>Studying the changes and continuity in crime and punishment from 1000AD until present day. The ability to form an opinion and interpret the world around you is a key feature developed in the course.</li> <li>• History does require a large amount of written work and as such students must be prepared to complete this kind of work. Good literacy skills are important.
